On 11 February 1999 at approximately 1200 hrs., your investigators met with Sharon Talmadge Latent Print Section Supervisor, Crime Lab Unit.

Your investigators received information from Doctor Korrel of O.C.M.E. that a fingerprint identification of the victim must be made prior to releasing the remains to the Funeral Director.

Ms. Talmadge agreed to accompany your investigators to the O.C.M.E. in an attempt to print the victim arriving at approximately 1300 hours. After several attempts, Ms. Talmadge was able to obtain partial prints from the victim.

As a result of not having any fingerprints to compare with the victims, your investigators transported Ms. Talmadge to the victim's residence. It was Ms. Talmadge's feeling, that by processing the victim's bedroom and personal items that latents would be recovered to compare with the prints recovered from the victim.

Several latents were recovered and Ms. Talmadge was transported back to the Baltimore City Police Departments Crime Lab Unit where a comparison was made.

Your investigator also had the occasion to speak with Special Agent Rick Dixon, Department of Justice Immigration and Naturalization Service, in an effort to obtain fingerprints from the victim's processing file. Agent Dixon indicated that the victim's file was currently filed in Harrisonburg Virginia. Agent Dixon then indicated that he would have the file Federal Expressed to his office on 12 February 1999.
