On 12 February 1999 Sergeant Lehmann organized a detail to search the Woodlawn and Garrison areas of Baltimore County in an attempt to locate the victim's automobile, a 1998 Nissan Sentra, grey in color, Maryland tag FSV-645. 

The area searched by the detail was roughly bounded by I-695 on the west, the Sudbrook and Pikesville neighborhoods in the North, Hilton Parkway on the East and Route 40W on the South. Particular attention was paid to the most likely route which would have been traveled by the victim from Woodlawn High to Campfield Elementary on 13 January 1999 as well as the neighborhoods surrounding Leakin Park. The area was divided into grids and each team given a specific area to canvass. This search lasted approximately eight hours and ended with negative results. The Baltimore County Police also contacted all private tow companies licensed in the County to remove vehicles from private lots with negative results.

In addition, the victim's vehicle was re-entered into Miles and NCIC as being stolen during the commission of a Homicide, NIC# V506062223, to hold for prints and contact Baltimore Homicide.
